O my God, I shall cry by day, and Thou wilt not hear; and by night, and it shall not be reputed as folly in me. 4. But Thou dwellest in the holy place, the praise of Israel. 5. In Thee have our fathers hoped; they have hoped, and Thou hast delivered them. 6. They cried to Thee, and they were saved; they trusted in Thee, and were not confounded. 7. But I am a worm, and no man: the reproach of men and the outcast of the people. 8. All they that saw Me have laughed Me to scorn; they have spoken with the lips and wagged the head. 9.
