

Introit (Ps. 26: 1-2)

Dóminus illuminátio mea et salus mea, quem timebo? Dóminus defensor vitæ meæ, a quo trepidábo? qui tríbulant me inimíci mei, ipsi infirmáti sunt, et cecidérunt.

Vs. (Ps. 26: 3) Si consístant advérsus me castra: non timébit cor meum.

Vs. Glória Patri, et Fílio, et Spirítui Sancto. Sicut erat in princípío, et nunc, et semper, et in saécula sæculórum. Amen.

Forgive us our sins, O Lord, lest the Gentiles should at any time say: Where is their God?

Vs. Help us, O God, our Savior; and for the honor of Thy Name, O Lord, deliver us.

Alleluia (Ps. 9: 5 & 10)

Allelúja, allelúja.

Vs. Deus, qui sedes su per thronum, et júdicas æquitátem: esto refúgium páuperum in tribulatióne. Allelúja

Alleluia, alleluia.

Vs. O God, who sittest upon the throne, and judgest justice, be Thou the refuge of the poor in tribulation. Alleluia.

Offertory (Ps. 12: 4-5)

Illúmina óculos meos, ne umquam obdórmiam in morte: ne quando dicat inimícus meus: Præválui advérsus eum.

Enlighten my eyes, that I never sleep in death; lest at any time my enemy say: I have prevailed against him.

Fourth Sunday after Pentecost

Communion (Ps. 17: 3)

Dóminus firmaméntum meum, et refúgium meum, et liberátor meus: Deus meus, adjútor meus.

The Lord is my firmament, and my refuge, and my deliverer, my God is my helper.
